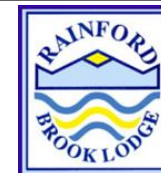




Hot and Cold places

ESSENTIAL HOT AND COLD PLACES VOCABULARY

Country	A place with independent land and it's own Government.
Desert	A place with very little rain covered with sand.
Human feature	A human feature is built or made by a human.
Physical feature	Part of the land or landscapes that can be touched or seen. Not made by a human.
Landmark	A usually large object on land that is easy to see and can help a person find the way to a place nearby.
Ocean	The whole body of salt water that covers most of the earth's surface.
Continent	A continent is a very large area of land that is made up of different countries.
Atlas	A book of maps.
Climate zone	Areas with distinct climates.
Equator	An invisible line around the centre of the earth that divides the earth into 2 hemispheres.
